## West Valley High School/Private Transportation/Parking Lot Rules

It is important for safety and efficiency that everyone follows the rules and guidelines for the proper use of our existing parking lots. If you choose to utilize the driving privilege and parking lots at West Valley High School, you are responsible for knowing and understanding the rules.

- All vehicles, except visitors, are to be registered with the security/main office and display permit in the vehicle. Register owner must sign form. Copies of insurance/license on file in main office.
- If a different vehicle is driven, a second form must be completed in the main office
- All drivers must be in possession of a valid Washington State driver's license and have proof of insurance.
- Vehicles must be parked correctly and in the proper parking lot. Students are not to park in the areas designated for visitors, staff, bus area, parking area or handicap.
- No parking at any time will be allowed that blocks emergency access, delivery access, or mail boxes.
- School buses have priority over private vehicles. All vehicles are to stop and wait for school buses.
- The speed limit on campus is 10 miles an hour. Always travel at a slow speed.
- All passengers must wear a seat belt while traveling in an auto on school property. No riding on back of, bumper or exterior part of any vehicles and the driver is responsible if anyone violates the rules.
- One way and traffic direction patterns are to be observed at all times.
- Students may not loiter in the parking lots at any time.
- Weapons will not be allowed in the vehicle on campus at any time. Students who bring weapons on school grounds will be expelled in accordance with due process. The expulsion may be from all schools in the state. Police and parents will be notified.
- All laws and regulations in regards to the \*Intermediate License Law\* for graduated licensing or teen licensing are to be followed.

### **Rule Infractions and Consequences**

- Non compliance of rules and regulations may result in fines:
  - Fines are to be paid within 3 school days and failure to pay fines will result in loss of parking permit privileges, disciplinary action, and/or loss of school activity including athletics and dances.
- Improperly parked vehicles will be removed at owner's expense. Blocked fire lanes, handicap areas or improperly parked vehicles will result in notification of the proper authorities, ie. Sheriff department,

Fire Marshall, etc.

- Speeding on the campus or dangerously operating a vehicle on or near WVHS, may result in loss of driving privileges.
- Students and parents are reminded that the driver of a vehicle is responsible for the safety and actions of their passengers.
- Students need to inform security officer of any changes of vehicle and insurance policies must be current at all times.
- Closed Campus students are not to leave campus during school hours (except for Running Start/YVTECH/Off Campus Classes)
  - If students leave campus without properly checking out or having an off campus permit then they will have their parking permit revoked for 1 week.

### PARKING PERMITS AND STUDENT DRIVING

District Policy 3243 -- Students may drive automobiles to and from high school. Students may not drive during the school day without the consent of the parent and principal. Students may not transport another student during class time unless consent of parents and principal has been granted through completion of a school approved form. A student may use the school parking lot subject to the following conditions:

- A. A student must register the car and purchase a parking permit in the ASB office. The student must possess a valid Washington driver's license and show evidence that there is a liability and property damage insurance coverage on the vehicle and acknowledge that he/she will assume full responsibility for any comprehensive or collision claims that may occur while on school property.
- B. Students may not occupy a vehicle (without permission) during the school day.
- C. Student conduct rules governing possession of alcoholic beverages, illegal chemical substances or opiates, firearms or a dangerous weapon extend to a student's vehicle.

A student who does not conform to the above rules shall be subject to corrective action and/or the following fines:

- 1. Backing into spaces (First offense and thereafter)
- 2. Taking up two spaces

3. Parking in a visitor or staff space

- 4. Parking in a non-parking space
- 5. No permit visible (First offense)
- \$15.00 FINES
  - 1. Parking on campus without purchasing a permit (First
  - offense)
    - 2. Blocking other vehicles
- \$20.00 FINES
  - 1. Parking in a fire lane
  - 2. Parking in a handicap zone

3. No permit visible (Second offense and thereafter)

4. Parking on campus without purchasing a permit (Second

offense and thereafter)

5. Parking in other than assigned parking space (First offense and thereafter)
